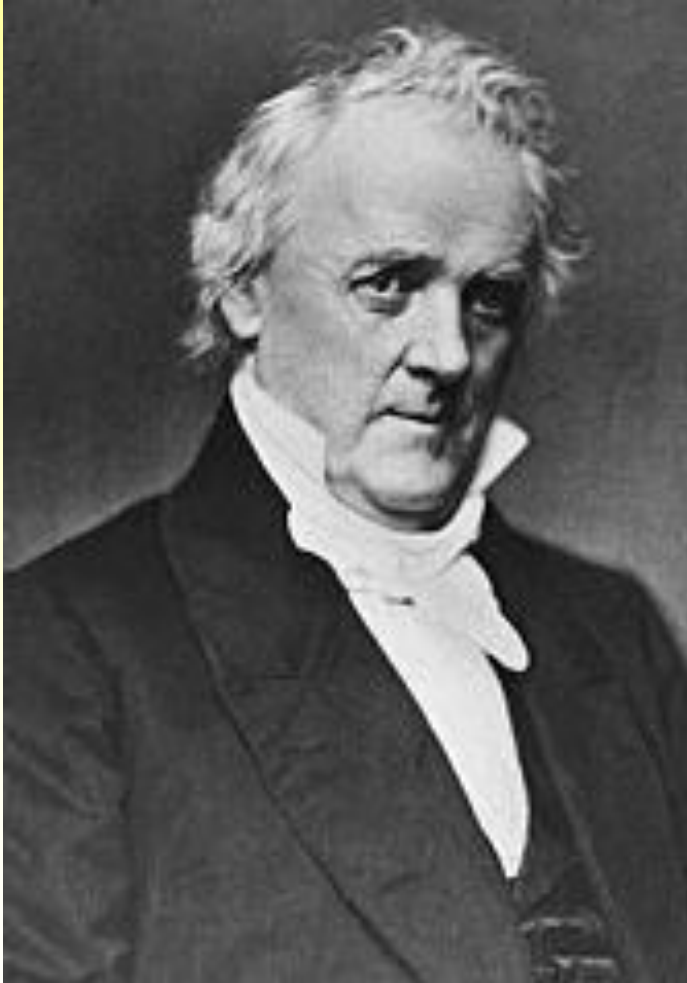

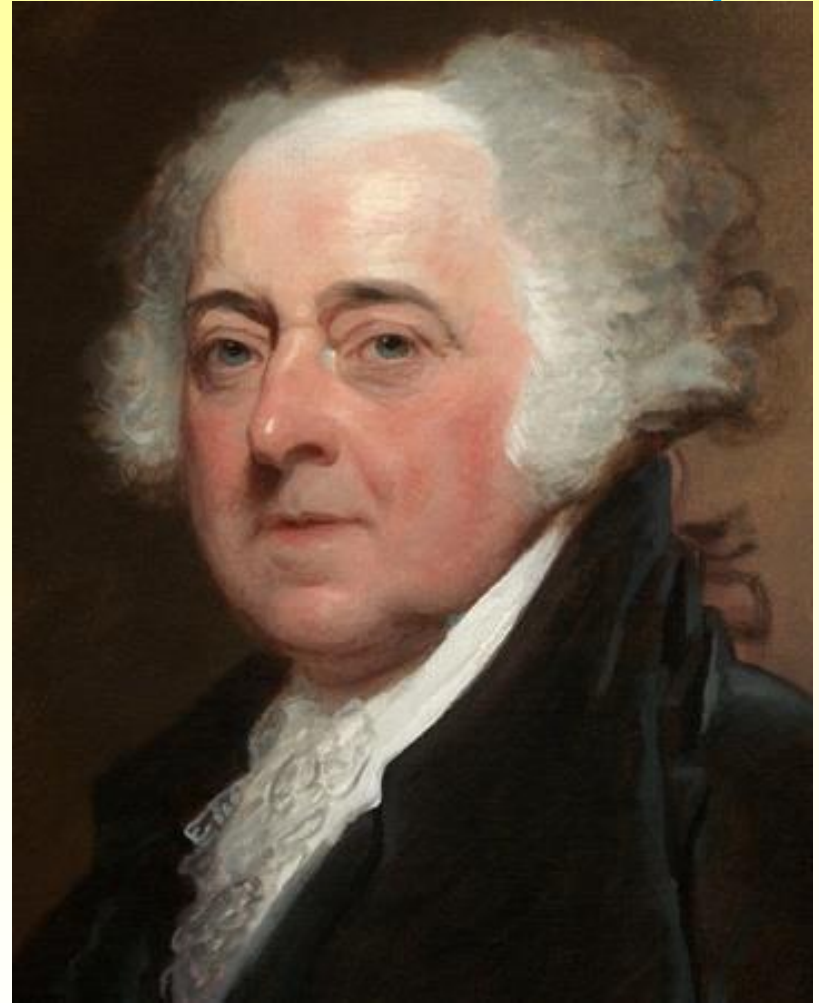

Early Presidents were born predominately in fall and winter. Those born in October were Theodore Roosevelt (previous slide), John Adams (pictured here), Chester Arthur, Jimmy Carter, Dwight Eisenhower, and Rutherford B. Hayes. Five were born in November, and five in August. In fact, most recent Presidents have had summer birthdays.

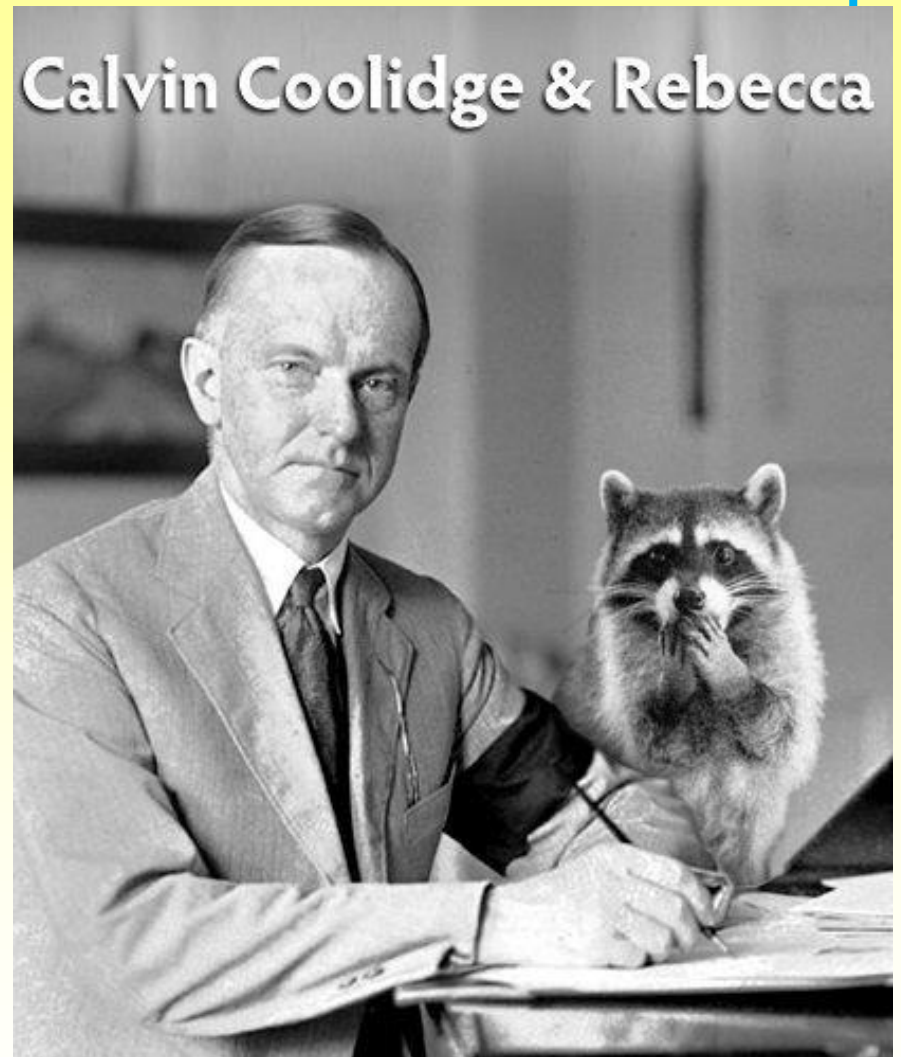

Two super pet- loving Presidents

Two Presidents had a LOT of animals on White House grounds. (Some made it to zoos.)

- Calvin Coolidge (1923-1929): had 12 dogs, 2 cats, 5 birds, a donkey, 2 raccoons, a bobcat, a black bear, a wallaby, 2 lion cubs, and a pygmy hippo.
- Theodore Roosevelt (1901-1909) had many dogs, cats, birds, guinea pigs, pet snakes, horses and other farm animals that were his children's pets, + a zebra, hyena, lion, wildcat, and 5 bears.
