Watermelon is among the most well-loved foods around the world. Stop for a moment to savor your picnic food memories; then take this quiz and perhaps learn something new.

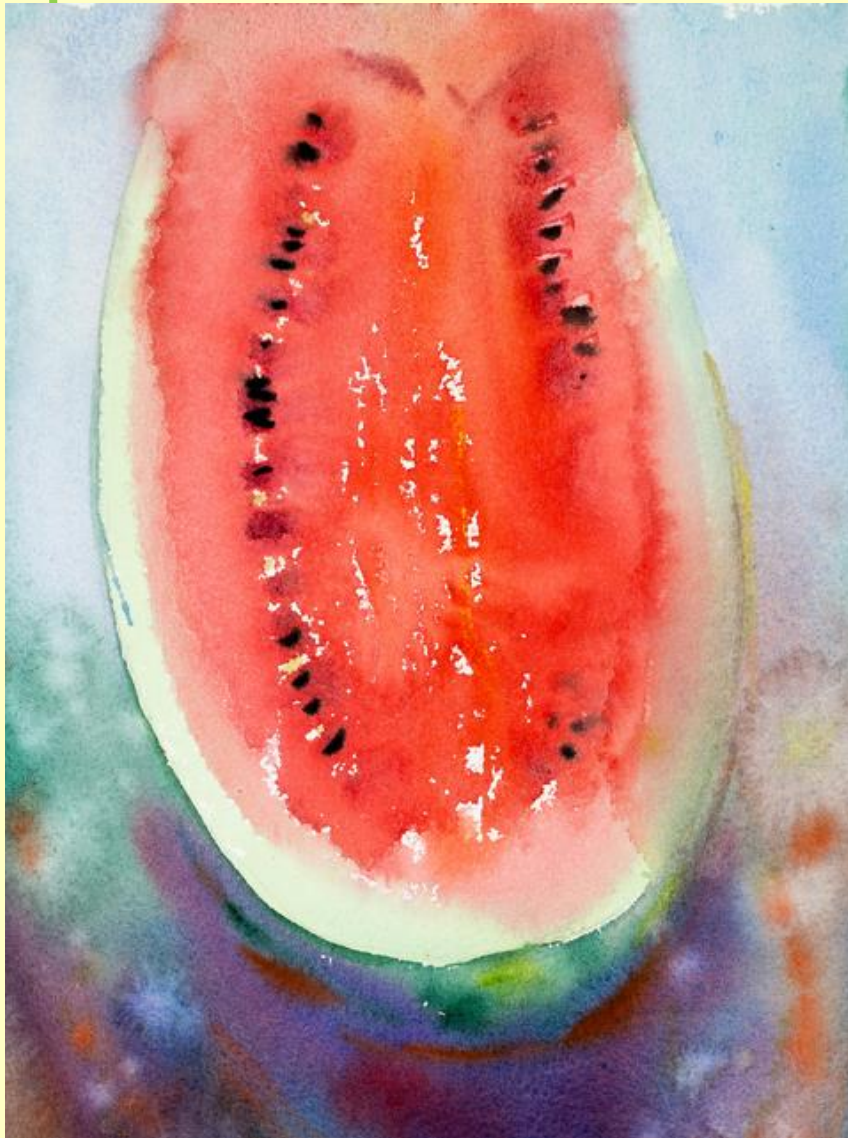




